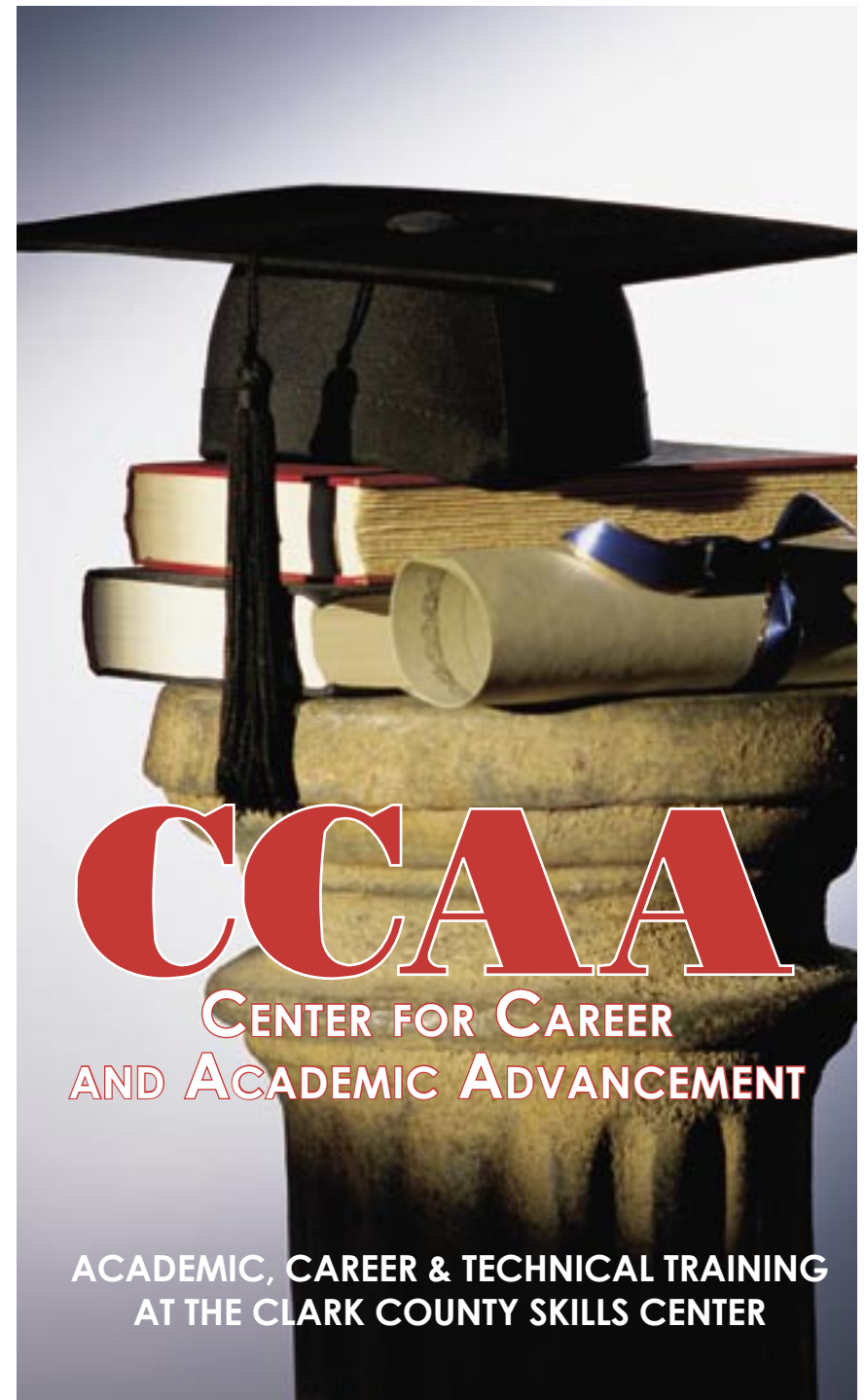

# CENTER for CAREER and ACADEMIC ADVANCEMENT



## PURPOSE and BACKGROUND

The Center for Career and Academic Advancement (CCAA) is a partnership between Educational Service District 112 and the Clark County Skills Center designed to provide high quality vocational and technical education to students who have dropped out of high school or are in danger of dropping out due to credit deficiency.

Students spend half of their day working on academic classes provided by ESD 112 and the other half in career education courses provided by the Clark County Skills Center. Based on the number of credits each student needs to graduate, a 19-credit diploma will be issued at the end of one or two years.

CCAA is designed to meet the needs of students by emphasizing the following principles:

1. Individualized student teaching strategies, counseling, and support services.
2. Intellectually challenging technical and academic studies.
3. High expectations for academic performance, conduct, and attendance.
4. Community service as a strategy for teaching life and professional skills as well as building self-esteem.

## ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

To Qualify, Applicants...

1. Must have been out of school more than 21 consecutive school days.  
OR a "Near Dropout", if referred by a high school counselor.
2. They must be 16 to 21 years of age.
3. Must be a resident of a Clark County Washington school district.
4. Must be "clean" from drug or alcohol abuse.

## ADMISSIONS PROCESS
