

# FINANCIAL RESOURCES

While ESD 112 is an essential part of state and regional education services, annual state funding for basic operational expenses is minimal. **Of ESD 112's \$131 million budget, only 1% is directly appropriated by the state.** The ESD uses that seed money to secure collaborative grants, manage fee-for-service partnerships and operate resourceful cooperatives and trusts. In fact, **for every \$1 invested in core funding, the ESD provides nearly \$131 in services!** That's a remarkable return on the state's investment.

Our bus drivers traveled approximately 1.5 million miles in 2024, transporting more than 900 students as far as Centralia, Goldendale, White Salmon, Wahkiakum, and Portland. Many of those students (approx. 65%) are experiencing homelessness or are in foster care. ESD 112 also provides bus transportation for the state schools for the Blind and Deaf.
