CALL TO ORDER

The ESD 112 Board of Directors Business meeting was called to order by Mark Hottowe, *President*, at 3:01pm on May 23, 2023. A quorum of seven members was present.

REPORTS AND DISCUSSION

- <u>Early Head Start & ECEAP Program Monthly Report</u>: Tina Vessey, *Compliance & Quality Assurance Manager*, reviewed highlights of the monthly report which included the opening of the 49th Street Early Learning Academy and a recap of the professional development day offered in April for all staff. The <u>Vancouver School District GRADS program</u> was recently evaluated and received great reviews on the onsite child care program provided by ESD 112 for teen parents working to stay in school and graduate. The ESD was awarded ECEAP and Early ECEAP conversion slots, as well as ECLIPSE funding to provide wrap-around resources for 20 children and their families.
- <u>ESD 112 Budget Report:</u> Gavin Hottman, *Chief Business Officer*, shared an update on the ESD 112 budget process. The full budget packet will be available in June and approval will be requested at the June board meeting. A budget extension will also be requested. Budgets are being developed for over 300 programs.
- <u>Superintendent's Report</u>: Tim Merlino, *Superintendent*, briefed the board on the following:
 - <u>Salary Survey Update</u>: Superintendent Merlino asked Marnie Allen, *Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources, Insurance Programs, and Legal Services*, to share an update on the staff salary survey. The final salary schedules will be presented for board consideration at the June Board of Directors meeting. The contracted consulted has reviewed 281 positions. The ESD currently employs over 700 people.
 - <u>Behavioral Programs</u>: The ESD is finalizing agreements with Camas and White Salmon Valley School Districts to open two new behavioral programs. The program in Camas will serve students who are typically developing but experiencing behavioral challenges. The program in White Salmon Valley School District will serve as a structured learning center for districts in the Columbia River Gorge.
 - <u>Changes to ESA Membership in 2023-24</u>: Mansfield and Palisades School Districts will join the ESA, and Raymond School District will leave the ESA. There will now be 30 districts within the cooperative.
 - <u>New Grants</u>: Tim asked Kathy Whitlock, *Executive Director of Student & School Success*, to share an update on new grant applications that were recently submitted to support school violence prevention and to continue to develop a regional school safety hub. Another grant application was made in partnership with Clark County Juvenile Justice to provide support for students as they transition out of juvenile

detention. The ESD is also partnering with White Salmon Valley and Glenwood School Districts on a Stronger Connections Grant. Lastly, a new Career Connected Learning grant was submitted with support from 100 local businesses.

- Changes in District Leadership: White Salmon, Kalama, and Toutle Lake School Districts are searching for superintendents.
- <u>Employee Acknowledgements & Recognition:</u> Monique Dugaw, *Executive Director of Communications and Public Relations,* recognized Chris Selcer, *Mental Health Therapist*, for his exceptional work at Liberty Middle School and shared a thank you from Share Vancouver to ESD staff for their donations during the recent hygiene item drive organized by ESD Connects.
