ACTIVITIES

Throughout the spring season, REACH students engaged in a multi week planting process to put native & annual plants in the ground. With help from our friends at Skyline Health, students spent a few weeks clearing, tilling, and prepping beds. After procuring plants starting from French's Farm in the Lyle community, students planted in various parts along the perimeter of the school playground. Each afternoon, students would support watering plants with hopes of building an ongoing relationship with them in the future.
