2021-2022	<p>Lyle Secondary is located in Lyle, Washington; a rural community with a high level of poverty</p> <p>The target population are all students in grades 7-12 that are not currently meeting benchmark standards in reading and mathematics regardless of socio-economic level.</p>	<p>Goal 1 - Provide academic, social and emotional support to underperforming students from high poverty communities to assist them in meeting benchmark standards in reading and mathematics</p>	<p>REACH uses evidence-based curriculum that has been recommended and/or supported by Schools Out Washington and other groups that promote quality afterschool programming particularly those that are aligned with Washington State K-12 Learning Standards for reading and math.</p> <p>REACH is held at the Lyle School District School Building which has allowed program staff to foster positive connections with school district personnel and classroom teachers to assist with helping their students to meet academic benchmarks.</p>	<p>Each program day includes homework help as needed particularly in the areas of reading and mathematics.</p> <p>A variety of enrichment activities are offered with a particular emphasis in the areas of reading and mathematics.</p>	<p>Students who regularly attend the program will show improvement in reading and mathematics based on classroom grades and/or state assessments.</p>	<p>Students' grades and/or state assessment scores will be reported using student profile forms</p> <p>Academic and enrichment activities are recorded by site staff on the weekly Lesson and Activity Summary</p> <p>School day reading and mathematics teachers will report academic improvement using end of program year classroom teacher surveys.</p>

Many families do not have the resources to connect their students to the broader community.</p> <p>Lyle Secondary is located in a remote, rural community which limits student interaction with the world outside their community.</p> <p>Students benefit from a physical and emotional safe place to be after school as many parents work out of the immediate area.</p>	<p>Goal 2 - Provide high quality, engaging, project-based enrichment opportunities that connect the school to the broader community and where each student is challenged academically in an environment that is physically and emotionally safe.</p>	<p>Strong collaborative partnerships allow REACH to provide more accessible and interesting services and resources to youth and their families including: arts education, nutrition, cooking, and music.</p> <p>Currently REACH has formal partnerships with ten community organizations and many more informal partnerships with other organizations.</p> <p>In order to provide a safe environment, REACH is held at the Lyle School building and transportation home is provided.</p>	<p>Ongoing enrichment activities include: art projects, STEM activities, cooking which involves reading instructions, measurements, and working cooperatively .</p> <p>Annual partnership events include: visiting artists in conjunction with Arts in Education of the Gorge (AIEG) and Fort Vancouver Regional Library (FVRL); and Creature Feature with FVRL.</p> <p>Field trips in and outside the local area offered primarily during summer programing.</p>	<p>Based on attendance records 75% of enrolled students will attend 30 or more program days during the program year.</p>	<p>Attendance is recorded each day by student sign-in sheets and reported by program staff.</p> <p>Students will report a high level of satisfaction with the program based on ongoing feedback sheets and year end student surveys.</p> <p>Students will participate in weekly planning sessions in order to foster a high level of student voice and choice as reported on the weekly Lesson and Activity Summary.</p>
